CRIMINALS BEWARE



Over the past few months numerous "Flock" automated license plate reading (ALPR) cameras have been installed throughout the city of Valley

Park. These cameras provide our police officers new ways to investigate and solve through the use of Vehicle crimes Fingerprint™ technology. Officers are now able to identify vehicles travelling within the city that are suspected of, or have been involved in, criminal activity. The Flock cameras allow our officers to search for vehicles by vehicle type, make, color, license plate state, missing / covered plates, and other unique features like bumper stickers. decals, and roof racks. These cameras have already assisted officers in Valley Park recover several stolen vehicles as well as locating wanted criminals.
