The "Holiday Shopping Season" is upon us again. The increase in retail shopping activity during this time of year also brings an increase in certain types of crime. The following tips provided below are suggestions on ways to avoid becoming a crime victim?

- Do not withdraw large amounts of money from the bank at one time, especially at ATMs.
- Conduct banking business during normal business hours instead of using an ATM for deposits.
- Keep your purse in a secure location. Do not leave your purse in a shopping cart for someone to grab while shopping.
- Be cautious about giving your credit card number over the phone.
- Always keep your vehicle locked. Place purchased items out of sight in your vehicle's trunk.
- Take all items of value (Phones, laptops, gifts, etc.) out of your vehicle when you arrive home.
- When going to and from your vehicle, remain vigilant for suspicious activity. Do not walk to your vehicle if you see suspicious people around. Walk back into the business and notify security or call the police.
- Try to park your vehicle in areas with good lighting at shopping centers.
- Take extra steps to secure your home. Do not leave packages on your front porch. Make every effort to have any deliveries made to your place of work to avoid having items sitting outside all day on your porch.
- If you travel for the holidays, please fill out the online Vacation Inspection Form found on the St. Louis County Police website under "services" section. You can also contact the precinct and request a vacation check with the desk officer.

Due to events occurring around the world with everyone's heightened awareness relative to threats of terrorism, we remind everyone to remain calm and confident in their local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies. Report anything appearing suspicious.
