NEED THE POLICE? Here is some important information you need to know.

The St. Louis County Police Department's, Bureau of Communications, recently implemented a new "AI" phone system to help expedite calls for service. When calling to have police dispatched for a <u>non-emergency</u> (636) 529-8210, simply saying "Dispatch" or "Dispatcher", will route the call to the dispatching center. If the system does not recognize what the caller is saying after two attempts, the system will automatically give a number prompt menu. Dispatch is number "8".

Since implementing this system, the overall call volume has been reduced by over 20% and has streamlined non-dispatch facilitation by 30 seconds or more. This has allowed for quicker dispatch of officers, which means quicker police response time to the citizens.

If you have a true emergency that requires immediate police response: DIAL 911

BEAT THE HEAT!

Keep your pets safe this summer.





Stay hydrated!



NEVER leave a pet in the car!



Asphalt test before walks

Limit places someone can hide. Keep shrubs less than 2 feet tall and leave 6 feet of space open below your tree canopy. Plant shrubs with thorns near windows and fences to deter burglars

Keep Locked!

Remove valuables including keys, wallet and guns



Shred personal information and breakdown boxes. An empty box of an expensive item advertises what's inside your home.

Use an USPS approved mailbox with a lock or mail checks directly from the post office
